Mental Health Navigator Deadline for Application: Until Filled

Cooperative Educational Service Agency 10 (CESA 10) is looking for an individual to serve as a full-time Mental Health Navigator. This is a grant funded, limited-term position for 2019-2021.

The ideal candidate would possess a Bachelor's or Master's Degree in a human services-related field including but not limited to social work, counseling, psychology, sociology, criminal justice, or child development/family relations. A Master's Degree in School Social Work would be preferred. Also, one or more years of experience with mental systems and public and private service providers

Performance Responsibilities:

- Collect and monitor data.
- Assist with the development and implementation of select school districts' systems and overall mental health protocols and policies.
- Serve as a collaborative team member with districts' student services structure.
- Meet with families in districts to assess and determine needs and provide 1:1 support and assistance for children/families to access mental health services.
- Develop individual Treatment Engagement plans for each referred student.
- Work as a liaison between school district staff, mental health providers, community and county partners, Department of Health & Human Services and families.
- Provide support for students and families with significant behavioral/social-emotional needs and support to their families.
- Provide parent and community education.
- Support district staff with student behavioral issues, including determining function of behavior and level of the crisis.

This is a full time, limited-term position. Salary will be competitive. An excellent benefit package will be provided which includes health, dental, life and disability insurance, retirement benefits, Wisconsin Retirement System pension, and paid time off.
